Message From Thack

A Call to Prayer and Unity

Next Monday is Inauguration Day. It is also Martin Luther King Day.

These two events have something in common besides sharing the same date in our calendar.

Dr. King dedicated his public life to racial equality and national unity. He once preached the necessity for a civilized society to strive to become a “beloved community.” King observed, *“But the end is reconciliation; the end is redemption; the end is the creation of the beloved community. It is this type of spirit and this type of love that can transform opposers into friends. The type of love that I stress here is not eros, a sort of esthetic or romantic love; not philia, a sort of reciprocal love between personal friends; but it is agape which is understanding goodwill for all men. It is an overflowing love which seeks nothing in return. It is the love of God working in the lives of men. This is the love that may well be the salvation of our civilization.”*¹

As our nation prepares for the inauguration of Donald J. Trump as the next President of the United States, we are reminded of the deep divisions that have marked this past election cycle. Regardless of our political leanings, as Christians, we are called to something higher—a unity of purpose centered on love, prayer, and faith in God’s sovereignty.

The Apostle Paul urges us in 1 Timothy 2:1-2: *“First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity.”*

As President Trump takes office, let us heed this call to pray—for him, his administration, and for all our government leaders, regardless of party. Pray for wisdom, humility, and guidance as they navigate the complexities of leading our nation. Pray also for peace and unity, that we might overcome division and work together for the common good.

At the heart of our Christian faith is the Great Commandment, which Jesus reminds us in Matthew 22:37-39: *“You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.”*

This commandment transcends politics, calling us to love God wholeheartedly and to extend that love to our neighbors—including those with whom we may disagree. It challenges us to respond with grace, compassion, and kindness, even when our opinions differ.

As we move into this new chapter of our nation's history, let us commit ourselves to be instruments of peace and reconciliation. May we show the world that our ultimate allegiance is to Christ, who calls us to be salt and light in the world. Let us work together to build bridges, seek justice, and reflect God's love in all we do.

Let us join together in prayer for our nation, its leaders, and its people. May God bless America with God's peace, and may God's Kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven.

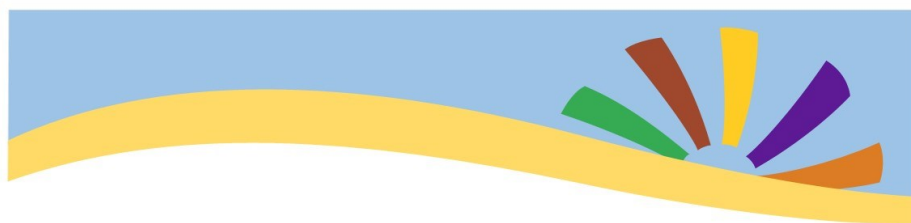
